SOLIDARITY WITH SACKED TEXTILES WORKERS

Many of the clothes sold in ZARA are manufactured in Peru by the employees of a company called Topy Top. In May 2010, 35 of these workers were sacked by the firm for attempting to organise in a trade union.

Topy Top employees often work 12 hour shifts and some are forced to survive on very low wages. According to a 2008 report by the Fair Labor Association: 60+ hour weeks are common, there are no health and safety measures, and bullying and "brutal harassment" are routine.

We believe exploitation and harassment must be opposed whenever and wherever it exists.

We stand in solidarity with the workers of Topy Top. Their struggle is our struggle. An injury to one is an injury to all!
